

The SWWRCF is an agreement for use by public and voluntary sector organisations based (or operating) in the counties of Carmarthenshire, Ceredigion, Neath Port Talbot, Pembrokeshire, Powys and Swansea for the provision of construction-related works, worth up to £1bn until 2024. The current Framework has delivered projects valued at £550m.

The framework includes;

- ▶ Projects from Central Government departments and their agencies, non-departmental public bodies, devolved administrations, NHS bodies, Local Authorities, the Police, the Fire Service, the voluntary sector, charities and private sector organisations procuring on behalf of these bodies.
- ▶ Framework is divided into lots based on project location and value:
 - Lot 1a West & Lot 1b East (£0 - £750,000)
 - Lot 2a West & Lot 2b East (£750,000 - £1,500,000)
 - Lot 3a West & Lot 3b East (£1,500,000 - £5,000,000)
 - Lot 4a West & Lot 4b East (£5,000,000 - £9,000,000)
 - Lot 5 All regions (£9,000,000 - £15,000,000)
 - Lot 6 All regions (£15,000,000 and above).
- ▶ Projects in the large value lots (Lots 4 to 6) are expected to be in the following sectors:
 - Education
 - Leisure
 - Social housing
 - Town regeneration
 - Health
- ▶ Potential spend for longer lots over 4 years:
 - £5-£9m - £44m
 - £9-£15m - £184m
 - £15+ - £224m
- ▶ Framework emphasis on local SMEs involvement and tangible local community benefits.
- ▶ Framework projects to run between 1st Quarter 2020 to 1st Quarter 2024.

Our supply chain strategy is designed to encourage openness, trust and collaboration and we have created a set of relationship guidelines to ensure that these aspirations underpin the way we work.

Our supply chain strategy is designed to encourage engagement with local suppliers and SME's. We are fully aware and embrace our responsibilities to support the local economy and our duty to create jobs and improve people's lives. SME's are supported in their training needs and setting up their systems using tools such as the Supply Chain Sustainability School.

If you would like to be considered for future partnerships, the next step is to register on our iPortal supply chain system. For stage one approval, you will need to be registered with ConstructionLine and accredited under one of the Safety Schemes in Procurement.



Subcontractor Relations Guidelines

VINCI was built on the strong values that underpin its identity. We strive, in our Together Programme, to reach out to all our stakeholders and engage in dialogue with them. The VINCI Manifesto presents our social and environmental responsibility policy. Our Code of Ethics and Conduct sets out the conduct expected of our employees. These Subcontractor Relations Guidelines spell out the six fundamental commitments made by the Group's purchasing and contract management officers, who will see to it that they are implemented, and reflect the importance of forging working relationships based on fairness with our subcontractors and suppliers.

COMMITMENT 1 **COMPARABLE SAFETY CONDITIONS FOR OUR EMPLOYEES & SUBCONTRACTORS**

Continuous improvement of worksite safety is an absolute priority for VINCI. Our management ensures that steps are taken to safeguard the health and safety of every person on our construction and operating sites. On each VINCI site, comparable safety conditions must apply to our employees and the employees of our subcontractors. In line with this commitment, the Group's companies support their subcontractors' own safety improvement programmes.

COMMITMENT 2 **FAIR COMMERCIAL RELATIONS**

To develop our business, we must forge long-term working relationships with our subcontractors. Since the financial health of our subcontractors is crucial to their viability, our purchasing and contract management officers undertake to reject abnormally low bids and to ensure that contractual clauses, especially those pertaining to guarantees and payment terms, are applied in good faith.

COMMITMENT 3 **FAIR CONTRACTING PRACTICES**

In order to work with efficient and effective subcontractors, our purchasing and contract management officers undertake to select subcontractors objectively on the basis of the best bid, under fair conditions and in compliance with local regulations.

COMMITMENT 4 **TRANSPARENCY IN BUSINESS RELATIONS**

To improve project execution and develop trust among partners, free-flowing and transparent exchange of information is essential. All information required for project execution will be shared in good faith among project participants, and care will be taken to maintain the confidentiality of information received and to respect the intellectual property rights of the participants.

COMMITMENT 5 **COOPERATION WITH LOCAL COMPANIES**

To help foster local employment, our teams undertake to make their best effort to integrate local companies in our projects. When conditions permit, we will include local companies in our tendering procedures and VINCI companies will foster the transfer to subcontractors of expertise required for project execution.

COMMITMENT 6 **COMPLIANCE WITH VINCI'S VALUES**

VINCI chooses to work with subcontractors who make a commitment to comply with the same values as those set out in our Manifesto and our Code of Ethics and Conduct.
